## THAILAND INTERCOUNTRY ADOPTION PROGRAMME



Last Updated: May 2023

Hague Convention	Thailand ratified the 'Hague Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption' in 2004. As both Thailand and New Zealand are signatories to the Convention, all adoptions must comply with the Convention's principles and procedural safeguards to be recognised and for the child to be entitled to reside in New Zealand.
<b>Central Authority</b>	Child Adoption Center, Department of Social Development and Welfare, Thailand
Legislation	The adoption is completed under the New Zealand Adoption (Intercountry) Act 1997 and the Hague Convention. The applicants are given custody of the child in Thailand (ie. not an adoption at this stage). The family then return to New Zealand for a sixmonth pre-adoption period. Once satisfactorily completed, the adoption is finalised under Thai law and is recognised by New Zealand.
Facilitation	There are two routes by which New Zealand applicants can undertake an intercountry adoption of a non-related Thai child.  1) Oranga Tamariki—Ministry for Children (Oranga Tamariki)  Applicants may adopt using the services of Oranga Tamariki and the New Zealand Central Authority (NZCA).  2) Accredited Bodies: Inter-Country Adoption New Zealand (ICANZ) OR Compassion for Orphans (CfO)  Applicants may choose to use the services of an accredited body and the New Zealand Central Authority (NZCA). ICANZ with its representative in Thailand, Friends For All Children (FFAC), and Compassion for Orphans have been accredited to facilitate intercountry adoptions between Thailand and New Zealand. An adoption by any of these routes is overseen and certified by the respective Central Authorities.
Relatives	Adoptions of relatives may be undertaken via an application to Oranga Tamariki. Whilst Thai law may permit New Zealanders living in Thailand or Thai relatives living in New Zealand to adopt in Thailand using Thai domestic adoption legislation, such an adoption will not be recognised by New Zealand and therefore will not enable the adopted child to right of entry, citizenship, and/or residence in New Zealand. A Hague compliant process is required for a Thai child's New Zealand rights to be established.
Citizenship and Residency	Oranga Tamariki, ICANZ, and CfO can only facilitate adoptions from Thailand for New Zealand Citizens or Permanent Residents who are habitually resident in New Zealand.
Travel Requirements	Both applicants are required to travel to Thailand. The adoption process in Thailand takes around 7 to 10 days. Interpreters may be required, particularly outside Bangkok.
Extent of Programme	Oranga Tamariki The Thai Central Authority operates a quota system. In each calendar year, the NZCA is advised if it will receive a quota. Since 2021 the NZCA has been advised that Thailand would not accept any new applications for children under 4 years but
