

Want help to get your driver licence?

If you are a young person in care or custody, you may be able to receive help to get your driver licence

To get help you must:

- be at least 16 years old
- be in the care or custody of Oranga Tamariki; or
- be subject to a supervision order, supervision with activity order; or
- be transitioned out of care or custody after commencing the driver licence initiative.

You can also get help with:

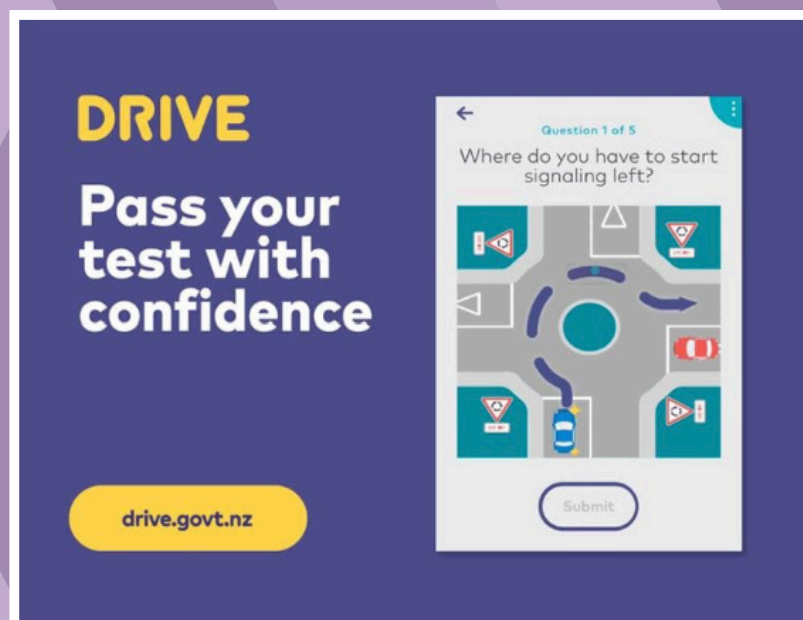
- a birth certificate, if required to obtain a driver licence
- up to 20 professional driving lessons
- test fees (including the cost of resitting).

If you want more information talk to your social worker or transitions support worker.

You can also get some online help

Apps available:

- Drive Go app (designed to give you everything you need to pass your restricted test)
- Drive VR app (virtual reality - which provides common scenarios for people to test and hone their skills before driving on the road).
